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PROGRAM STATEMENT

The Environmental Hearing Board functions as the statutorily established trial court of state-wide jurisdiction which hears certain environmental cases. It hears appeals from actions of the Department of Environmental Protection and under appropriate circumstances, the Board can issue orders superseding actions of the Department. The Board holds non-jury trials and issues Adjudications. Trials before the Board are very similar to non-jury civil trials before Common Pleas Courts, the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania or Federal District Courts. The Board also issues legal opinions and orders on pre-trial dispositive motions such as motions to dismiss and motions for summary judgment as well as on non-dispositive motions such as discovery motions and motions in limine. Appeals from the Board are taken to the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania.

The Board's decisions and operations are key in ensuring that economic activity in the Commonwealth is completed in a manner that is protective of the environment. The Board protects the due process rights of all who appear in front of it including ordinary citizens, corporations of all types and sizes, and various groups and municipalities.

The five judges of the Board are appointed by the Governor subject to confirmation by the Pennsylvania Senate. The judges of the Board are Chairman and Chief Judge Thomas W. Renwand, Judge Michelle A. Coleman, Judge Bernard A. Labuskes, Jr., and Judge Steven C. Beckman. The Secretary to the Board is Christine Walker.
